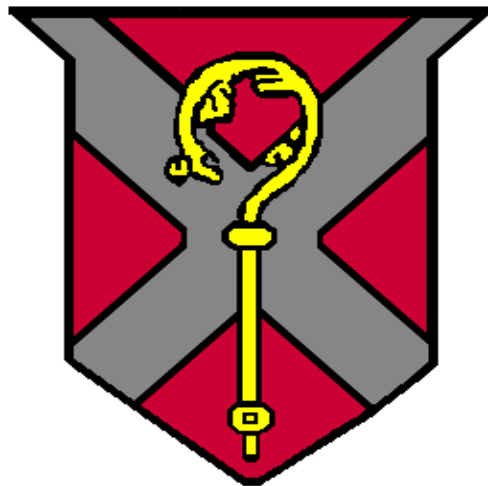

Uniform Policy

All our children are expected to wear the agreed school uniform, and this is seen as important in establishing the school's identity in the community. In joining the school, parents are agreeing to work alongside the school to ensure that this policy is upheld wherever possible.

The school recognises the need to keep uniform affordable. To ensure this is the case, the school does the following:

- ✓ Provides uniform without profit
- ✓ Does not demand that the uniform uses the official school logo
- ✓ Offers free uniform to any family who are unable to afford to supply their own (each circumstance is assessed alongside the parents/carers)
- ✓ Offers a swap or reclaim system for nearly-new and pre-loved uniform

Nursery Part time pupils

When children are invited to attend the Nursery on a part time basis, parents have the opportunity to purchase the full school uniform or elements of it. These are provided free of charge to any parent who meets the eligibility criteria for Free School Meals (Please ask at the school office for further details)

Full time pupils

Boys

- black trousers
- burgundy knitted jumper or tank top (ideally with school badge)
- plain white buttoned shirt
- Clip-on tie (real tie optional from Year 3)
- black school shorts in the summer (optional)
- black or grey socks

Girls

- black pinafore dress/skirt/trousers
- burgundy knitted jumper, tank top or cardigan (ideally with school badge)

- plain white buttoned blouse/ shirt (with top fastening button)
- clip on tie (real tie optional from Year 3)
- yellow and white gingham dress (no tie required)/ black shorts in the summer (optional)
- black, white or grey socks **or** black, grey or burgundy tights

Footwear

Parents are requested to ensure children wear appropriate, sensible footwear. By appropriate and sensible we mean:

- Plain black shoes, not trainers or boots, not 'flashing'
- Good grip (but no deep tread)
- Closed toe (no open toed sandals)

Hairstyles

Shapes or patterns cut into hair are not permitted, neither are extreme haircuts. Hair which is longer than shoulder length is required to be tied back at all times with a plain hairband/bobble/.

Make-up and Nail Polish

Both make up and nail polish and not permitted to be worn in school. Parents/carers will be telephoned to come and remove them.

Jewellery

Jewellery is not allowed to be worn in school. The exceptions to this rule are ear ring studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance, such as a crucifix on a chain. They may also wear a small watch (not a smart watch than connects to a mobile phone device). All objects need to be removed for PE and swimming to prevent them from causing injury. This needs to be done by the child or parents will need to provide plasters so studs can be covered during the session.

P.E./Sports wear

Navy / black shorts and tracksuit bottoms, plain white T-shirt and trainers. Though football boots are not essential for games activities, shin pads are required by all children participating in football activities to avoid unnecessary injuries.

PE equipment should be brought to school each Monday in a named bag, left in school for the week, and taken home on Friday. If a child forgets their kit our office assistant will telephone to ask parents to bring the kit in. P.E. is a mandatory part of our curriculum and it is vital children have kit in school.

For Key Stage 2 swimming, children will require appropriate swimming attire (trunks not shorts or a one piece bathing costume) and a towel. A swimming hat is optional, however long hair must be tied back if not secured under a swimming hat.

When should it be worn?

The school uniform should be worn at all times when in school or when participating in academy organised events outside normal school hours when requested to do so, unless specific instructions have been given not to do so (i.e. some school trips and non-uniform days etc). Children are expected to come and go from school in full school uniform.

What happens when children do not have the correct uniform in school?

Parents will be notified by text if their child is wearing incorrect uniform with an agreement made on how the issue will be rectified.

If a child is missing a tie, the school will ring the parent/carer to ask for one to be brought in. If this is not possible, the school will lend one of its 2 spare ties for one day only and this must be returned at the end of the day. If neither of the spare ties are available, the school will provide a new tie at the cost of the parent.
